# **Beware! Construction Ahead!!**

**S**t. Mary's, our beloved 150+ year old building on Emmett Street, has been suffering the effects of aging. In 2011 we found out that the joists and pilings under our kitchen had rotted and the structure would have to be rebuilt. During the past 7 years this has been a nagging concern for all of us. Recent signs of continued decay made it clear that this had to be addressed immediately. During the next couple months we will restore the structure, rebuild a kitchen, replace our laundry room and add a powder room. The project will be daunting!

With the amazing skill of our team, Carnevale Eustis Architects, Dymond Quality Builders, and Teague Lumber Kitchen Designers, as well as the generosity of National Appliance Warehouse, we have been able to navigate this project with people who share our concern for homeless families. For the most part, our home will stay open and our families will be housed safely. Thank you to each and all for your part in completing the amazing task that is now underway.

Rosie<sup>\*</sup> arrived at St. Mary's after living in a hotel for over a month with her two children. Despite being an extremely hard working, full time employee, her wages were not enough to keep a roof over her family's heads and provide them with the basic needs of food and diapers. From the minute Rosie stepped through St. Mary's front door, she was thanking the staff and everyone around her for taking her in and welcoming her family.

Due to her self-reliant and independent nature, it took Rosie a little while to become comfortable with receiving help. However, once Rosie and her children settled in, she began to accept people's care and quickly understood that everyone was acting in her best interest. With this in mind, she began to take full advantage of the resources and comfort provided to her by staff, case management, and the other residents of the shelter.

Rosie continued to work full time while staying at the shelter and was able to save up for when she located a residency for her family. With the help of agencies serving Chester County, Rosie secured child care for her children, medical assistance, and housing! In addition to the hard work she put into providing these basic needs for her family, she was able to build her educational learning by attending resourcing workshops and conferences.

Her children's faces were lit with excitement as she packed up the car in preparation for her move. With much appreciation for their time at St. Mary's, Rosie thanked us and said good-bye. Although Rosie and her children will be missed, we at the shelter share in her family's success and wish them best on their journey forward.
