Marie has also been able to obtain subsidized after-school childcare for her children which will be tremendously helpful to her as she continues her job search and when she starts working again. Marie attributes her motivation to succeed to her children and her faith and has said that these things "keep me going".

Marie's daughter recently celebrated her 5th birthday at St. Mary's and everyone was invited to join in having some delicious cake and singing Happy Birthday to the birthday girl!
