Amelia arrived at St. Mary's with her 1yr old daughter and determination in her eyes. She had a plan, outlined what her pressing needs at the time were, and worked with her case manager to help check accomplishments off

of her list.Within a short time after arriving, Amelia was able to transfer her benefits over to Chester County, secure daycare for her daughter, meet with Wings for Success for a dressing appointment, renew her license, go on multiple interviews, and accept an offer for a job!

Getting that phone call from her employer with an offer made her feel great and Amelia breathed a sigh of relief as she could finally cross "job hunting" off of her goals list. Amelia has been focused and on the path toward a successful outcome and is excited to start work soon and save up for a new place. She also plans to partner with local Chester county agencies to assist her with security deposit payments and rental assistance once she finds a suitable housing option.

Amelia is self-driven and has worked hard to achieve her goals. She is supported by her family here at St. Mary's and we wish her continued success in her housing search as she spends the remainder of her time with us.

Volunteer Spotlight: Brooklynne Younker

This is a story about Brooklynne Younker, whose name is pronounced "BROOK-lin YONkur." That's right friends. Her name sounds like two of the boroughs in New York City



(minus the "s" in "Yonkers"). But even more ingenious than her name, is the generosity of Brooklynne's heart. The beneficent Brooklynne quickly became one of our best volunteer friends at St. Mary's Franciscan Shelter.

It all started three years ago. That's when Brooklynne Younker moved to Phoenixville, Pennsylvania. Brooklynne would pass by St. Mary's every day on her way to work. She would think to herself, *Hey, I wonder what they do there?* One day she finally decided to look it up. After returning from work, she logged on to the internet and did some research. Brooklynne found a few videos that St. Mary's Franciscan Shelter had posted online. The videos were about a few of the families who had come

through the shelter. They detailed how the shelter had helped

those families. After that, Brooklynne was hooked!

Brooklynne Younker has been helping the playgroup at St. Mary's Franciscan Shelter for over a year, since February of 2018.

Playgroup is a volunteer option that currently occurs five nights a week, Sunday to Thursday, from 7:00 to 8:00 PM. On Monday nights, playgroup gives shelter parents the ability to attend parenting classes and house meetings. The rest of the nights, it gives adult residents the freedom to accomplish housework tasks they couldn't *during* the day. For volunteers, it gives them freedom to accomplish service tasks that *makes* their day.



When asked what her favorite memory of volunteering at St. Mary's Franciscan Shelter in Phoenixville is, it's hard for Brooklynne Younker to decide. But finally, one of them, Brooklynne says is, "Every time I'm leaving St. Mary's Shelter, one of the kids runs up to me and gives me a huge hug. He or she thanks me for spending time with them. It's always the highlight of my day!" Brooklynne's smile is glowing.

So, yes. Even though volunteering can make others' lives better, it can also make *your* life better. Brooklynne Younker's glowing smile is a shining example of that.
