A Teacher and a Reacher: St. Mary's Family Garden



Gertrude Jekyll (1843-1932), a British horticulturist and shining star among garden enthusiasts, once said, "A garden is a grand teacher. It teaches patience and careful watchfulness; it teaches industry and thrift; above all it teaches entire trust." And while a garden does those things indeed, St. Mary's Family Garden is more than a teacher. It's a reacher.

All one needs to do is reach back a few months into the past -- to the exact date of April 6th, 2019 -- to see how far back St. Mary's Family Garden reaches into the future.

April 6th was St. Mary's first Garden Day of the year. Though it was a joyous event, one we happily shared with the good people of Saint Elizabeth Parish, St. Mary's first Garden Day of 2019 was a culminating event for more reasons than fun.

For starters, this April day in 2019 picked up where 2018 left off. It was not just in a new calendar, but also in a new backyard, on the same plot of land that once housed a 10,000 square foot building. It now housed 10,000 feet of square air.

That's because in the beginning of 2018 there stood an 80-year-old schoolhouse. And in the beginning of 2019, there stood a one year-old demolition site. The debris of the demolition site was cleaned up by April's gardening group. In doing so, this first gardening group of 2019 saw not only the land where the future garden would be housed, they also prepared the land that would expand St. Mary's home.

Another gardening group and two months later, St. Mary's Family Garden reaches forward again, from spring to summer.

The June transition period brings about professional landscape work. Week by week, new installations pop up. First a wooden split-rail fence, then a gazebo, and finally a mixture of shrubbery inside the fence and around the gazebo. Together, all of these smaller installations make up one big installation, a focal point and land finale: St. Mary's Family Garden.

Though, we all know garden work is never truly finished. Not like a lesson assigned for the pupils it teaches. Instead, a garden is more like a blessing entwined with the people it reaches.




VOLUNTEERS ARE THE HEART OF SAINT MARY'S ...

Graced Perseverance....

"Carrie" moved into St. Mary's with her two children after challenging circumstances with her younger son's childcare. This childcare issue led to her losing her job and unable to re-sign her lease due to her inability to pay the rent. Carrie was determined to find a new job but found it difficult to establish adequate childcare without a paycheck. Through meetings with case management and careful planning, she was able to apply for subsidized childcare benefits and re-establish childcare with a local program that was willing to accept the subsidy.

While in the program at St. Mary's, Carrie was able to update her resume which helped her to quickly land a new and more stable job. Even with some difficulties resulting from a planned minor surgery, Carrie was able to continue searching for housing on her own with assistance from case management and a local community resource. She put considerable individual time and effort into researching potential housing options in the county that would still allow her to keep her child in day care and for her to continue working. Through connections with these community resources and her own determination, Carrie was able to find a new place and move before her time in the program came to an end. She is very excited to keep working and to keep moving forward to make sure she gives her and her children the best life she can. All of the staff here at St. Mary's wish Carrie continued success as she continues to press forward!
