FROM OLD CLASSROOM TO NEW HOME.... OUR SCHOOL RECREATED

Rejoice with us! The transition of this sacred ground from an amazing learning center to a lovely living space has begun. Each classroom will become a 400 square foot apartment with its own living area, kitchen, bathroom, and two bedrooms. The new area will also include a large laundry room, a state-of-the-art meeting room and storage for both the shelter and the transitional housing. Homeless families who have successfully completed the 8-week shelter program, have a job and some savings will qualify for the transitional apartments. Thus they will be able to benefit from 18 to 24 months in the apartment, engage in educational programs, and receive the assistance of a Case Manager. Transitional housing will help residents to strike a motivating balance between external support and personal responsibility.

Renovating a 19th century schoolhouse can only happen with generous volunteers and donors as well as our team of amazing professionals who are guiding and directing us through this process.

A big shout-out to our volunteer professionals:

Mike Lese, a recently retired pre- construction specialist came forward and offered to help us. His ability to read architectural and mechanical drawings with an eye out for St. Mary's has made this part of the project go smoothly. Analyzing the data in each bid proposal and leading the process to choose our contractor was not only scientific and successful! Mike will stay with us as our representative during the construction.

Steve Niggeman, Board member and chair of our facility committee has been working tirelessly to make sure we are completing the needed tasks and remaining true to our mission. Steve sees buildings and outreach projects such as ours with simplicity due to his extensive experience as Executive Vice President of Metro Commercial. His experience working with



many high-profile tenants assures us that the job will be done on time, within budget and pardon the pun, with class!

Travis Peyton, formerly the President of the Board of St Mary's and a Partner HPE Group Engineers of Berwyn has gifted us with the amazing skill of a professional engineer and a great heart for homeless families in Chester County. Travis and his company donated services for all the mechanical drawings which include replacing our existing central heating system with a ductless heating and air conditioning system.
